



DISASTER RELIEF Yellow Cap Credentials

Credentialing Process

- 1. All "new" disaster relief volunteers must complete Yellow Cap Orientation and complete a background check.
- 2. Volunteers are not required to be a member of a Southern Baptist Church to participate in Yellow Cap training, but must express the core values and beliefs as identified below.
 - Jesus Christ is the Son of God who came into the world, born of a virgin. He
 lived a sinless life and died on the cross for the sins of the world. He rose
 again to give us eternal life and is alive today, preparing a place in heaven and
 interceding for those who place their faith in Him alone as the Savior.
 - Each of us should have a personal relationship with Him.
 - Belief in Jesus is the only way to Heaven.
- 3. Volunteers are generally not allowed to travel with a TBM Disaster Relief unit until Yellow Cap Orientation and background checks have been completed and the Volunteer has a current TBM DR Badge. Exceptions must be approved in advance by the State Disaster Relief Director.
- 4. After initial Yellow Cap Orientation, volunteers must renew credentials every five (5) years including a new background check, new picture and issuance of a new badge by attending a Yellow Cap Orientation Class.
- 5. Specialty Training cannot be used to renew Yellow Cap Credentials.
- 6. Leading a Specialty Training class cannot be used to renew Yellow Cap Credentials.
- 7. All previously trained Yellow Caps whose credentials have expired must renew credentials by attending a current Yellow Cap Orientation.
- 8. Volunteers whose Yellow Cap credentials are current but issued by another state or convention may receive a TBM badge after completion of a TBM background check and approval by the TBM State DR Director Other state or convention background checks are not accepted by TBM.
